



2022 Poster Presentation Guidelines

Please read all information carefully before creating your poster and attending the symposium.

Poster Presentation Rules and Guidelines

- You must register and attend the event to present your poster or appoint a co-author to present in your stead.
- All poster boards are numbered. Be certain to mount your poster on the appropriate board. Do not move board numbers or posters from their pre-assigned board.
- Poster boards and pushpins will be provided.
- You are required to bring your poster with you – we will not accept posters shipped in advance.

Poster Logistics

- Poster **set up** will be on Tuesday, October 18, 2022 between **7:30-10:00 am**.
- Poster presenters **must present** their poster in person during the **Poster Reception** on Tuesday, October 18, 2022 at **6:00-8:00 pm**.
- Posters **should remain** on display until after lunch on Thursday, October 20, 2022.
- Posters **must be removed** no later than **4:00 pm** on Thursday, October 20, 2022.

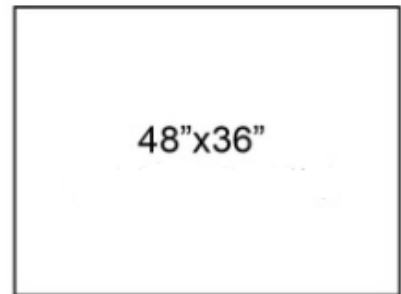
Poster Content

Include all parts of your scientific project.

- Background
- Objectives
- Methods
- Results
- Conclusions

Poster Size

Each poster should be created in landscape format as **48 inches** (121 cm) wide and **36 inches** (91 cm) tall.



Designing Effective Posters

- Identify two or three principal messages to convey. Choose a title that captures your main point.
- Prepare a 6-inch high headline strip at the top of your poster indicating the abstract title, authors, and affiliations.
- Lettering should be at least 1 inch (2.54 cm) high. Audience members should easily read your poster from 3 feet away.
- Summarize current research in graphic form whenever possible. Use charts, tables, graphs, pictures, etc., and minimize the amount of text.
- Arrange materials in columns and use white space to help direct readers logically through your poster.
- Prepare your poster on laminated poster paper, or fabric, allowing for space to mount it on the poster board with pushpins. Do not use heavy cardboard.
- Posters should be self-explanatory but not comprehensive. Elaborate on the topic during conversations with attendees.

Include your email address to assist viewers with contacting you later. Make sure to have your business cards available for those who request contact information.
